

ADDRESS OF JOHN PAUL II TO AN ECUMENICAL DELEGATION FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SAN FRANCISCO (UNITED STATES OF AMERICA)

Monday, 7 April 2003

Dear Archbishop Levada, Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am pleased to welcome your *ecumenical delegation of Catholics, Greek Orthodox and Anglicans from the San Francisco area.* This pilgrimage, which coincides with the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, is a testimony to your commitment to the growth of Christian unity through sincere dialogue, common prayer and fraternal cooperation in the service of the Gospel.
