

GREETING OF JOHN PAUL II TO THE PARTICIPANTS IN THE COLLOQUIUM ON "TRUTH, JUSTICE, LOVE, FREEDOM: PILLARS OF PEACE"

Dear Friends,

I am pleased to welcome you, the participants in the Colloquium on "Truth, Justice, Love, Freedom: Pillars of Peace". In a particular way I greet the Secretary of the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue, Archbishop Pier Luigi Celata, and the Head of the Organization for Islamic Culture and Communications in Tehran, Ayatollah Mahmoud Mohammadi Araqi.
