

ADDRESS OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO A group of Jews and Christians from Boston, USA

Thursday, 6 March 1997

It is a pleasure for me to welcome you, *Jews and Christians from the Boston area* actively involved in improving relations between the followers of both our traditions. The aim which you have set yourselves, of fostering mutual knowledge and understanding, and of increasing respect and cooperation between us, is very close to my heart. I earnestly encourage all such efforts, especially when they seek to strengthen the close spiritual bonds linking the children of Abraham and the followers of Jesus of Nazareth (cf. *Nostra aetate*, n. 4).
